What are the varying forms of delivery?

This will run as dual synchronous learning, where learning is planned and delivered for in-person. Students can have the option to attend virtually in real time if needed using technology such as MS Teams or Web Ex.

How do I know which courses to take?

The Port Elgin location will have 2 courses running each semester. In order to finish the program in Port Elgin, students will need to commit to taking the 2 courses each semester as we will only have one intake in May 2024.



What is the cost of the program?

There is no program fee when studying part-time. As a part-time student, you can take 1, 2 or 3 courses at a time in any given semester. Payment is per course, as you register.

In this course, students focus on developing their business acumen in the context of delivering successful projects in a rapidly changing business environment. By looking at an organization's strategic environment, students gain an understanding on where projects fit with organizational objectives. Students learn how market awareness, business models, strategic planning, effective management, stakeholder relationships, and operational functions all play a role in project benefit realization.
