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PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Professionals in the healthcare field recognize that mental disorders, including addictive behaviours, play a prominent role in the many complex clinical presentations which all front-line clinicians face. In this program, students are equipped with the appropriate clinical competencies to recognize and include mental health issues and build effective plans of care to ensure good clinical outcomes. Students are exposed to a variety of intervention options such as motivational interviewing, cognitive behavioural therapy, acceptance and commitment therapy and dialectical behaviour therapy. Ultimately, students develop the skills necessary to effectively work with clients to deliver enhanced services with a focus on quality across a variety of settings.

In this course, students are introduced to evidence-based clinical competencies that shape effective counselling practices for working with people with mental health challenges. Students learn core skills for engaging, collaborating with and guiding clients/patients towards enhanced therapeutic outcomes. Students hone the intentional communication skills necessary for work in the diverse and challenging contexts of mental health service delivery, and explore the ethical principles that guide and the practice issues that emerge in clinical counselling.
